ScotMoves Application Form Notes

1	Your cattle herd mark, starting 'UK5nnnnn' – is required.
2	Please affix your barcode sticker. As well as providing your main CPH, we scan the barcode when processing the form.
3	If you have an existing ScotEID username, that you wish to use for ScotMoves, we will use this for your ScotMoves registration. This will be the username you use to login to ScotEID.
4	We can create a ScotEID account for you. Your 'username' should be one word, fairly short and easy for you to remember. We also require an email address that you have access to. We will inform you of your password by post, which you can change afterwards at any time.
5	This must be in the format CC/PPP/HHHH.
6	<p>When using additional holdings, you must keep your cattle separate from the livestock of other keepers who are occupying the same holding.</p> <p>To prevent standstill rules taking effect when livestock move on and off your holdings, you can make a declaration to keep your cattle separate from other keepers livestock. This may also help protect the health of your herd. In these circumstances a movement of livestock on to the holding by another keeper will not trigger a standstill for your livestock.</p> <p>To do this you must declare by ticking the box that: Your cattle will be kept in separate fields/grazings and will not mix with the livestock of other keepers, and/or your cattle will be housed in separate shed/buildings from the livestock of other keepers.</p> <p>However, where you are unable to comply with the declaration above because;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• your cattle will be in the same fields/grazings with the livestock of other keepers, and/or• your cattle will be in the same shed/buildings with the livestock of other keepers; <p>then you will have to comply with the standstill requirement after other keepers move livestock on to the holding.</p>
7	<p>Your main holding will be your 'default holding'. This means that when you purchase cattle into your business, these animals will automatically be assigned onto your main holding in your holding register. If you do not wish this to be the case and would like to nominate another holding, please enter the CPH in this column in the table.</p> <p>For Keepers on a 7000 code</p> <p>If your main holding CPH is a 7000 code, you must nominate a default holding (in the box above) for animals brought into your business. Animals cannot be assigned to a '7000' code CPH on your ScotMoves holding register.</p>
